WEBINAR DESCRIPTION

The 2022 Annual Report webinar will share new findings and trends related to the national state of college student mental health during the 2021-2022 academic year. Additionally, this year's report examined five years of data from 95 institutions related to students' decision to voluntarily withdraw from school during counseling services. During the webinar, Brett will review 21-22 mental health trends, risk and protective factors associated with voluntary withdrawal from school during counseling services, and implications of these findings.

CCMH gathers and analyzes de-identified data as part of the routine practice of seeking mental health treatment from colleges and universities in the U.S. and internationally. The CCMH 2022 Annual Report describes 190,907 unique college students, nationally and internationally, seeking mental health treatment; 4,688 clinicians; and more than 1.2 million appointments from the 2021-2022 academic year.
