WEBINAR DESCRIPTION

The 2024 Annual Report webinar will share new findings and trends related to the national state of college student mental health during the 2023-2024 academic year. Additionally, this report examined students with a history of suicidal or self-injurious behaviors (S/SIB) who receive college counseling center services. Specifically, CCMH investigated these students' symptoms, presenting concerns, stressors and contextual factors, service utilization, and treatment outcomes. Brett will review the latest mental health trends and discuss the critical role college counseling centers serve in supporting suicide prevention and campus safety efforts within higher education.

ABOUT CCMH

CCMH gathers and analyzes de-identified data as part of the routine practice of seeking mental health treatment from colleges and universities in the U.S. and internationally. The CCMH 2024 Annual Report describes 173,536 unique college students, nationally and internationally, seeking mental health treatment; 4,954 clinicians; and more than 1.2 million appointments from the 2023-2024 academic year.
